Re: Statement of Continued Relationship

The College of Charleston Sailing Program and the South Atlantic Yacht Racing Association (SAYRA) have enjoyed a continuous relationship of cooperation for many years. That relationship began with the use of the College's various sailboat fleets for SAYRA sponsored USYRA events as early as 1977 with our fleet of Soling class keelboats and, more recently, USSailing events, beginning in 1988, in our fleet of J-22 class keelboats. These events have also included our dinghy and singlehanded fleets. We have co-hosted with local yacht clubs, at the quarterfinal, semifinal and final levels, various ladder events including, Scars, Bemis, Smythe, Adams, Mallory, Hinman, and Prince of Wales cup competitions.

This cooperative effort has been offered to SAYRA in the spirit of service to the sailing community. It also fulfills one of the goals of our Sailing Program; to provide such a service whenever possible.



**General Guidelines for the use of College of Charleston Sailing, (CofC),
J-22 sailboat fleet by South Atlantic Yacht Racing Association,
(SAYRA).**

1. Boats are to be used for SAYRA Sponsored events to include, but not limited to: US Sailing ladder events, SAYRA Championships, other racing events as agreed upon by the two parties.
2. CofC must be notified at least one month in advance of the event, or immediately following completion of the annual SAYRA schedule; notification will include dates, times and number of boats requested for the event.
Use of boats is contingent upon availability; SAYRA will be given preferred priority, but with deference to the CofC racing schedule, for racing events.
3. CofC boats come equipped with spinnakers, winch handles and all other standard racing equipment.
4. SAYRA will provide borrowed boat insurance with applicable deductible checks payable to College of Charleston Sailing.
5. Boats will be sailed from and returned to CofC Sailing Center each day of racing.
6. CofC reserves the right to monitor the event and to provide change boats for the event.
7. Boats must be cleaned and secured to the CofC docks after each use.
8. SAYRA agrees to use due discretion for crew competency and for observance of weather conditions appropriate for the racing of J-22s.
9. SAYRA agrees to assign only competent race committee personnel to events using CofC J-22s.
